Field to Fork Parkland trail



During this trail you'll learn how the Parkland was a source of food for this estate, the different ways in which the land has been worked historically to produce food, and how it is managed today.

Your step by step route guide to the Field to Fork Parkland trail in Tatton Park (Please note your first waymark is number 4.)

- The 'Field to Fork' trail starts here and is a circular 3 mile walk. This is a fantastic place to view the full length of the 1 mile long Tatton Mere. Continue downhill, passing the road on your right, to the t-junction at the bottom.
- Before you continue, you may wish to visit our bird hide shelter overlooking the beautiful Melchett Mere by taking a quick detour just to the right at the t-junction. Then follow the road towards Knutsford for about 500 yards.
- 6 Take the grass track to the right. There is a gentle slope up the hill and down again on the route.
- Follow the grass track to the left which goes up to the line of trees. Keep the fence on your left and enjoy spectacular views across the park. Look out for the hidden 'Ice House' just before waymark 8.
- 8 Head to the gateway in the fence downhill. The Choragic monument in Tatton Park's Gardens can be seen on your left as well as beautiful views of the Mansion.

- You may wish to take a short detour here for some refreshments by turning left to visit the Stableyard with its shops and facilities. Our Hebridean rare breed sheep can be viewed in the fields near the adventure playground behind the Stableyard. To continue the trail, cross the road and walk towards the clump of trees straight ahead.
- Now walk straight on to the standing stone memorial. You are very likely to see Tatton's famous Red and Fallow deer here – please do not approach them too closely.
- Continue along the stone track.
- Turn right onto the grass again, heading between the two young trees in line with the far woodland.
- Follow the obvious grass path to the right and keep the fence on your left all the way.
- 14 From here continue with the fence on your left. Access is a little difficult past here so to avoid this (if you wish) take the short cut through 'Millennium wood' on the right.
- Turn right onto the stone 'Mill Pool' track. You will pass the Old Hall on the left as you walk back to waymark 4 and complete the circular walk.
