## Our NEW wonderful walking trails for 2025...

### Ranger's Nature Trail

Follow a 1 hour walk to the Old Hall and back again. It offers easy walking on level ground and is suitable for families with older children. There's an additional 30-minute loop round Melchett Mere. Nature Trail Booklet available from the Gift Shop for 50p.

### Dairy Wood Way with the Billie the Beetle Trail

This short, circular woodland walk starts opposite the main car park and is perfect for mini explorers to learn about Billie and her forest friends.

### Beech Avenue Conservation Trail

This 1.5-mile trail runs alongside ancient beech trees planted in 1739. Learn about historical, wildlife and landscape features as you walk.

### Field to Fork Trail

This 3-mile circular walk starts at the front of the mansion. On your journey we'll show you how food has been sourced from the parkland over the years and how important the parkland is for a sustainable future.

### Millennium Wood

Millennium Wood is a beautiful, protected area of parkland where over 30 indigenous trees have been planted. This short loop trail will teach you all about the species planted and their impact on the ecosystem.
