A winter flower...

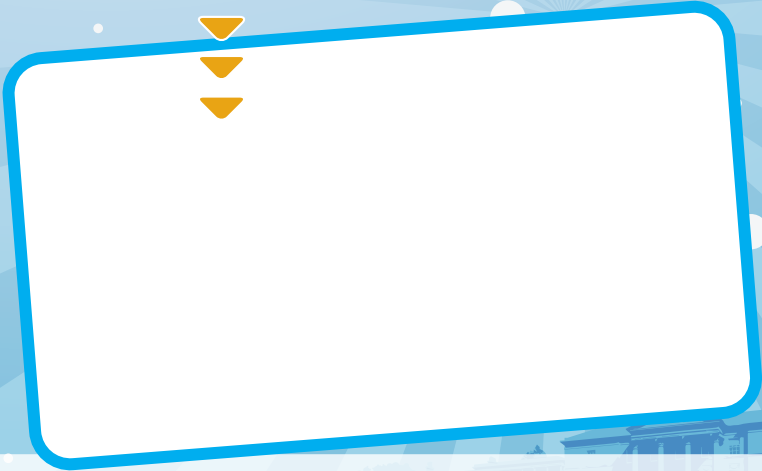

If you head over to the meres you will see lots of ducks (wildfowl), some of which are with us just for the winter. There will also be geese and maybe a heron or two looking for fish around the edges of the water.
